

## ACPA Publication Agreement

In consideration of the publication of the Author's paper (the "Paper") in the ***Proceedings of the American Catholic Philosophical Association*** (the "Proceedings"), the Author hereby assigns and transfers to the **American Catholic Philosophical Association** (the "ACPA") certain copyright and other intellectual property rights in the Paper as follows

- a) for the first publication of the Paper in the Proceedings in any medium including but not limited to printed format, microform, database, CD-ROM, or other any form of electronic publication and/or transmission. The Author understands that the ACPA will hold copyright to the Proceedings as a collected work and to the Paper as part of this collection.
- b) for the publication of the Paper in all future reprints and versions of the Proceedings, in any medium including but not limited to printed format, microform, database, CD-ROM, or any other form of electronic publication and/or transmission.

The Author also grants to the ACPA or its authorized agent

- a) the right to give permission for photocopying, duplicating, and/or downloading the Paper as published in the Proceedings, and
- b) the right to give third parties permission to republish the Paper or part or parts thereof in any medium including without limitation in printed form, microform, database, CD-ROM, and any other forms of electronic publication and/or transmission.

After the Paper has been published in the Proceedings the Author may republish the Paper in any print format for any educational or instructional purpose in which the Paper is made available for use without charge. The Author is free to publish revised and/or longer works derived from this Paper, and explicitly agrees that any such derivative work by the Author shall acknowledge the original publication of the Paper in the Proceedings. The Author agrees that the ACPA or its authorized agent shall manage all licensing of the Paper as published in the Proceedings, and understands that appropriate permission fees may be charged for any republication of the Paper in a work intended to generate revenue.

The Author warrants that s/he has the right to grant the license and permission set forth above. If the Paper was prepared jointly with other authors, the signing author has informed the co-author(s) of the terms of this copyright transfer and is signing on their behalf as their agent and represents that he or she is authorized to do so. The author(s) further warrant(s) that the Paper is the author's original work and has not been published before; that it contains no libelous or other unlawful statements; and that it does not infringe on the rights of others. If excerpts from copyrighted works are included, the author(s) has (have) obtained or will obtain permission from the copyright owners and will credit the sources in the article. In the event of any question about rights or permissions the Author agrees to contact the ACPA or its authorized agent to seek clarification.
